Structure

- Seminars focusing on themes relevant to Church Leadership are offered cyclically in four semesters.
- A special seminar focusing on a particular issue in the life of the Church is offered periodically.
- Synchronous attendance, either in person at LMU or online.

Main requirements

- The submission of a licentiate thesis of approximately 100–150 pages.
- The obtaining of four seminar certificates at GCL seminars and/or in the disciplines of the Practical Theology Group, i.e., Canon Law, Pastoral Theology, Liturgy, Religious Education and the Pedagogy of Religious Education.
- A Licentiate examination in Practical Theology, which is divided into two parts. Firstly, a three-hour written exam in one of the Practical Theology disciplines (excluding the discipline in which the Licentiate thesis was written). Secondly, an oral examination covering four Practical Theology disciplines. Usually GCL as the main field of study, alongside three others chosen by the student.

Enrollment procedure and academic qualification

Prerequisites:

- Completion of a full course of study in Catholic theology, i.e., Five years of philosophical and theological studies. Study periods completed and academic achievements attained at a foreign educational institution can be credited.

Participants:

- Catholic theologians from all over the world (seminarians, clerics, religious and lay people) interested in pursuing their studies in the „second cycle“.

- English
- The licentiate examination and the licentiate thesis can be taken in either English or German.
